Discussion Questions for Murder on the Orient Express

- 1. Do you think Hercule Poirot is more or less effective as a detective than Sherlock Holmes? Why or why not?
- 2. How do Poirot's methods differ from those of Holmes? How are they the same? Which character is more believable?
- 3. What was your general impression of the novel? Was it believable? Why or why not? Did you think that the supporting characters were believable? Why or why not?
- 4. Did you anticipate the ending of the story? If not, which character did you think committed the crime? Why? Was the ending believable? Why or why not?
- 5. Did the author effectively set-up the story? Did she provide enough clues so that the story could be solved? Is it helpful for mystery authors to provide somewhat difficult clues to a story, or should they make the crime unsolvable except by the protagonist?
- 6. Poirot claims to rely on a combination of intellect, intuition, logic and gut feeling to determine the murderer. How is this different from the methods used by Sherlock Holmes?
- 7. Did you like the character of Hercule Poirot? Why or why not? Is it necessary to like the character, or is an admiration of his methods sufficient?
- 8. Which of the characters in the novel (other than Ratchett) is least likable? Which of the supporting characters is least believable? Which of the supporting characters was most believable?
